CASE STUDY:

TELESCOPE HEALTH: *Launching a COVID-19 Testing Site in Record Time*









In the early days of the COVID-19 outbreak, medical professionals knew that mobilizing testing capabilities would be crucial to controlling spread of the disease. With so little known about the virus and vectors for infection at that time, ensuring that testing happened safely was paramount. Initially, it was also important to try and limit testing to people who showed symptoms of infection, because personal protective equipment and testing resources were in short supply.

Jacksonville-based start-up <u>Telescope Health</u>, a telemedicine provider and subsidiary of Emergency Resources Group, believed it had the answer. The company devised a solution by creating a system where residents experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, such as cough, fever or loss of sense of smell or taste, would first be assessed by a medical professional via a virtual visit to maintain a socially-distant environment. After this screening, and if symptoms warranted, the patient would be scheduled for a viral test to verify an active COVID-19 infection. This methodology was designed to control the number of patients at the testing location for the safety of those on-site and ensure the conservation of testing resources.

As Telescope Health noticed the increasing case rates across Asia and Europe, its leadership collaborated with the City of Jacksonville to pilot this testing program. The catch? Everything had to be done in less than one week. There was also significant financial risk for Telescope Health to pursue such a novel project without any guarantee it would launch successfully. Ultimately, the testing program would be supported by the City of Jacksonville and Telescope Health was able to provide crucial care services for Duval County residents.



Many moving parts coordinated under EXTREME TIME PRESSURE

In addition, the firm correctly advised Telescope Health to scale up its staffing in order to meet expected patient loads during the health pandemic. Smith Hulsey & Busey also identified and worked to mitigate any potential liability for Telescope Health.
